CREDO

Pastor Jami has accepted an invitation to attend a CREDO conference in Prescott, Arizona, May 16-23rd. The eight-day conference could be known as the “Priest Academy.” Priests in full-time parish ministry are randomly selected from a computer file with The Church Pension Fund. When your name is selected, the priest must complete several pre-conference surveys and information forms that focus on personal and professional wellness. Then, over the course of the conference, priests meet in plenary sessions, small groups, and private consultations aimed at assessment of their personal and professional lives. The Church Pension Fund pays for all but \$500 of the conference cost. Pastor Jami will attend CREDO as her continuing education commitment for this year.

The Vestry of St. Andrew’s in the Pines has sent a recommendation to the Commission on Ministry and Bishop John Smylie that Gail Randall enter into an ordination process for the diaconate. Tickle, Founding editor of the Religion Department of Publishers Weekly, is recognized as an authority on religion in America. In addition to her popular lectures and numerous essays, articles and interviews, Tickle is the author of more than two dozen books on religion and spirituality, most recently, "The Great Emergence, How Christianity is Changing and Why," and "The Words of Jesus, A Gospel of the Sayings of Our Lord." She also authored the notable and popular "The Diving Hours" series of manuals for observing fixed-hour prayer.

As those of you at church last Sunday were told, we have been blessed once again with a grant of \$50,000 by the Foundation for the Episcopal Diocese of Wyoming for our outreach to our Christian brothers and sisters in Tanzania.

This is our third grant award and will again support the students and faculty at Msalato Theological College and Bishop Stanway primary School.

The funds for students' scholarships will be for the fall 2011 and spring 2012 semesters. The funding for the additional computers and mattresses for the renovated dormitories, a gift from the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta, has been wire transferred so they can be acquired in time to enjoy at Msalato's 50th anniversary this June.
