



Confirmation, Reception, Reaffirmation and things Episcopal

These words are found on page 412 in The Book of Common Prayer – “In the course of their Christian Development, those baptized at an early age are expected, when they are ready and have been duly prepared, to make a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism and to receive the laying on of hands by their bishop.” This moment of “mature public affirmation” is called Confirmation in the Episcopal Church. It has been awhile since we have had a time of confirmation with the bishop at either St. Andrew in the Pines or at St. John the Baptist's. This fall I would like to begin Confirmation classes at both churches, with classes starting in early September in Big Piney in order to be ready for Bishop Smylie's visitation on November 19-20. Because of the summer visit by Bishop Smylie to St. Andrew's, we will have their confirmation service whenever we can schedule a visit from either Canon Vern Strickland or Bishop Smylie.

Typically, confirmation classes, or lessons about the Christian faith and the church, are offered to youth from age 12 and up and to adults who have never been confirmed and wish to do so. In addition, at the same service, the

bishop will receive adults into the Episcopal Church that wish to be “received into the fellowship of this Communion. And those who desire to reaffirm their faith commitment may do so during the same service.

These three options – confirmation, reception, and reaffirmation- are part of the rituals that mark our faith journey in the Episcopal Church. They are not required in order to be part of this church community or to be considered a member of the church. They are options, options that facilitate deeper exploration of one’s faith and the theological teachings of Anglicanism, the foundations of the Episcopal Church.

I intend to offer separate classes for youth and adults because of a comfort level with the types of questions and discussions that might occur within the different age groups. I will use a variety of materials with the youth, including some of the Via Media lessons. I will use a wonderful book called “The Anglican Vision” for the adults. Everyone is invited to participate in these classes whether they wish to go through the formal ceremony with the bishop or not. Some churches call the adult “confirmation” classes – Inquirer’s Classes because they offer an opportunity for asking questions about Episcopalianism and for learning more about our doctrine and sacraments and spirituality. In addition, my husband John is exploring offering a book study this fall on the book, “American Grace – How Religion Unites and Divides.” This will give two adult education offerings in the fall. Sunday School classes this fall will include two age groups – youngsters up to Third Grade and a 3-4th grade group. Cheryl Essington has offered to coordinate that program and our Wednesday evening Youth Groups will continue much the same as last year. That’s it for now with “Things Episcopalian” in Pinedale and Big Piney, Wyoming!

Sarah Hixson started the meeting with formation; Jami will ask Jon Gibson to share next month.

The meeting was opened with prayer.

Minutes of the last meeting: Tim Crawford moved to approve the minutes from May 16, 2011, Cody Saxton seconded the motion, all were in favor, motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Cody Saxton moved to approve the financial reports as presented, Tim Crawford seconded the motion, all were in favor, motion carried.

Mindy Seehafer and Susan Gulbrandson discussed the mortgage loan for the Nursery property. The note will be renewed at the principal balance of \$222,172.03 for the next five years at 3.25% interest. The payment for the next 5 years will be \$1,082.68. The interest rate will adjust every five years to the Wall Street prime. Tim Crawford moved to keep the mortgage payment at \$2,835.52 if there were funds available, Sarah Hixson seconded the motion, all were in favor, motion carried.

Senior Warden: Dave met with St. Johns to discuss service times.

Junior Warden: Cody reported that John Anderson, Tim Crawford and Jon Boroff repaired the fence at the Nursery property.

John Anderson requested to close off the back of the car port for storage use. He would like to install a gutter over the sliding glass doors at the Rectory. Sarah Hixson moved for the Church to provide materials for the gutter project, Angie Thomas seconded the motion, all were in favor, motion carried. Tim Crawford offered to help.

Rector's Report: Jami stated the Vestry received a letter from Credo stating she attended and behaved well.

Delegates to the convention are Gail Randall and Patty Washburn. Tim Crawford volunteered to be an alternate. Sarah Hixson moved to approve Tim as the alternate, Cody Saxton seconded the motion, all were in favor, motion carried.

Old Business: July 16, 2011 will be the BBQ for the 21 – 40 age group at the McKee-Vana residence.

Mike Key installed the new computer.

About thirty families still need photos for the new directory.

New Business: Cody will hang a sign for the summer service hours.

ML will organize a garage sale in August. Please bring your best junk (no clothes) to raise money for the Sun Room addition to the Rectory.

July 31 is the Church picnic at Sandy Beach.


