
A Voice in the Wilderness



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Senior Warden's Report Dave Lankford



St. Andrews is in full change mode. We all had the opportunity to say good-bye to Wes, Laura, and Emma, we know that they will be missed, but the time is now to start the process of looking for a new priest.

The Vestry met with Margaret Babcock from the Diocese on the 14th of September and she laid out to us that the usual time to hire a new priest is one year. We have been fortunate in the past that it hasn't been as long, but realistically we have to plan for that. The diocese is going through the process of selecting a new Bishop and frankly we don't know how that will affect us. During the search process, Margaret gave us two options for interim solutions. Support priests, who we book week by week, filling in with morning prayer, or an interim priest that we would sign a contract with for up to a year that would give us someone 3 weeks a month to take care of the congregation. The vestry opted at this time to go with the support option, and start the search process immediately. So we will be scheduling the support priests thru Cheryl in the office. I have talked with an interim priest in Utah who is coming on the 18th of October to give us the benefits of going that way. All the information that we can get will help in the decision.

As we are going ahead with the search process, a search committee is the first order of business. I would like anyone who would be interested in serving on that committee to contact me by the 4th of October (367-4820). The vestry will establish the committee on the 12th of October and Margaret will be back to meet with them on the 25th of October. We would like the meeting on the 25th of Oct. to occur after our service on Sunday. The search committee will be the lead group in finding our new priest.

October 4th, a priest could not be found because of the Diocesan Convention, but seeing as how things usually work out, Rev. Carol White of the Congregational Church contacted me and invited us to a World Communion service at her church. The service should be very similar to ours and she has asked that if you have any clothes from where your family might have emigrated from you wear them and/or you bring bread from that country or region for communion. The service will be at 10.30 a.m. at the Congregational Church.

Services for October and the remainder of the year have been altered a little. Using support priests, it seems that it works best that they come into town on the Saturday before the services, perform services at 9 o'clock in Big Piney and 11 o'clock in Pinedale, which then gives them the opportunity to drive home in the afternoon. So, we will be going back to one service in Pinedale.

Change is in the works, we as the vestry will do everything possible to keep you informed, but remember if you have a question please call one of the members. God Bless.

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Overview of Search Process:

- Put together Search Committee of 6-9 people representing different aspects of congregational life (one liaison from vestry, usually Sr. Warden). Mandate: Recommend 1-3 candidates to the vestry.
- If deciding on Interim Pastor—vestry interviews and writes letter of agreement.
- Create two profiles of St. Andrew's ideal candidate: one for the national Church Deployment Office, which helps match clergy looking for new positions with ministry opportunities in the parishes, diocesan offices, and church-related organizations (Margaret will help with this), and one that St. Andrew's sends directly to interested candidates"
- Gather potential names (resumes and CDO profiles will all go to the Bishop's office).
- Bishop forwards acceptable names to Search Committee to process.
- Search Committee may 1) choose up to 5 candidates to visit and then bring in 2-3 of these to visit congregation and vestry OR 2)bring in 2-3 candidates to worship and actively interview with steering committee and vestry. In both cases, these candidates must also meet with the Bishop.
- Vestry decides which candidate to call and consults with Bishop about the choice.
- Vestry extends the call and move new rector and family.

Bishop Search Update as of Aug. 27, 2009

All Quiet on the Western Front... But Busy, Busy Behind the Scenes!

The Wyoming Bishop Search and Transition Committees met face-to-face earlier this month in Casper for two days of training and planning facilitated by our national church consultant Suzanne Foucault.

Report from Linda Anderson, Search Committee chairwoman ~

The process of discernment and the role of the bishop was a primary focus of the Search Committee's meeting. The education sub-committee has been teaching the committee as a whole about these important topics, and at the Casper meeting we spent time in prayer and conversation, particularly about the criteria for discerning the next bishop for Wyoming. With guidance from our consultant, Search members carefully studied the Diocesan Profile to consider more fully what Wyoming Episcopalians said about their vision and aspirations for our diocese. We listened for the voice of the Diocese as spoken by you in the Profile comments. From this, we gleaned eight critical criteria for screening bishop applicants. Applicants' essay responses, resumes, Church Deployment Office files, telephone interviews and references will be viewed with an eye toward how each connects the critical criteria.

Clergy wishing to be considered for the episcopate in Wyoming must submit their applications by the August 31st deadline. The Search committee will meet in person twice during September for further training on evaluating applicant essays, CDO files, resumes and letters of reference. We'll also be trained on how to conduct reference checks and telephone interviews.

The entire Search committee has met every week by phone for the past several months. The time we have spent together in person and on the phone has bonded us into a cohesive group. We don't always agree, but have with God's grace been able reach common decision. The committee appreciates your ongoing prayers and support. The next few months will be especially important as we begin discernment for the slate of candidates and we ask for your continued prayers.

Report from John Peacock, Transition Committee co-chairman ~

Transitions Committee members also participated in the recent meeting at Casper. We especially appreciated having our consultant, Suzanne Foucault, on site with us and the great meals provided by Cindy King and Pamela RW Kandt.

At the top of our current To-Do list is planning for the Saturday evening dinner at Diocesan Convention in Casper. We spent a good deal of time brainstorming the farewell celebration for Bishop Bruce Caldwell and all we'll say at this point is October 3rd will be an evening you won't want to miss or will soon forget!

The Transition Committee is largely responsible for organizing the walk abouts with the bishop candidates, the electing convention for the new bishop and the consecration service for the bishop-elect. At our recent meeting, we reviewed what has and has not worked well in the past and then envisioned what an ideal event for Wyoming would look like in 2010. Our committee will soon begin monthly conference calls as planning for these important events moves into high gear. We are honored to be trusted with these tasks and ask for your prayers and God's guidance as we go about our work.

Our Tanzanian Connections Task Group is pleased to announce that this week St. Andrews in the Pines received a check for **\$50,000** from the Foundation for the Episcopal Diocese of Wyoming!

The check is the Foundation’s response to a grant request submitted in June requesting funds to provide scholarships for Tanzanians who are studying to become priests at Msalato Theological College, scholarships for children at the Bishop Stanway Primary School and computing equipment to expand MTC’s limited current capability.


The response from our friends in Tanzania was **“HALLELUJAH/ALELUYA”**.

Excerpt from email to Tom Davenport from Sandra McCann, Communications Director, Msalato Theological College upon receipt of the grant from the Diocese of Wyoming:

“I was just writing to Tally and Jessie that it is too bad you couldn't be here to receive all the blessings that I have--to see the faces, smiles, tears when the students learn that their fees will be paid or what remains of them. They really can't believe it! I have just seen the last of the 21 out the door. I have taken all their pix and they are all to hand me a letter to hand carry to the states so I will mail pix and letters once I am home. One woman from Kenya who had paid all but 240,000 said: Teacher, All I have to depend on is my husband and I am going to call him right now. She is from Kenya and they had been saving for years for her to come, but still were about \$200 US short. Many Kenyans come here because it is so much cheaper and we have a good reputation.”


