

The Rector's Remarks

My favorite quote from C.S. Lewis is, "Christianity is a statement which, if false, is of no importance, and if true, of infinite importance. The one thing it **cannot** be is moderately important." He is right in saying that by its very nature our faith cannot be of moderate importance, but I think that is how many of us, myself included, treat our faith. We say it's important. Some of us even go so far as to say it the most important thing in our lives, but the question for me is whether or not that is evident to the world around me. If I met a stranger and they were to watch me for several days without my collar, would they guess that I was a Christian? Would they be shocked to hear me say that my faith is the most important thing in my life? I hate to think what some of the answers might be, and if you have an answer to these questions please don't tell me. But seriously, I often wonder if our lives reflect our faith. I know that I have asked these questions in one form or another before, but I believe if we are going to strive to grow and to examine our lives, these are questions we have to ask. If you are like me and you don't always like the answers that you come up with when you ask these questions, then a simple question follows. What are you going to do about it? Simply asking the questions doesn't do anyone much good, unless we do something about it. For me the simple answer is that I have to make my faith my number one priority. That means that when

I look at my resources, my time, my energy, my passion, my money, that my faith must get first choice. That's not the way most of us treat our faith. We don't read and study because we're too tired or there is just not enough time, but putting my faith first means that I study before I go to work, before I go snow machining, before I do my chores around the house. Putting my faith first means that I treat study and prayer the way I treat eating or sleeping. They are things that simply have to be done in order for me to live. I know that sounds extreme, but the very act of placing that kind of emphasis on our relationship with God, will in and of itself force us to grow and to come closer to being the women and men that God is calling us to be. We will all have experiences or times in our lives where God reveals himself in new exciting ways, and our faith will grow by leaps and bounds, but it's the everyday discipline that prepares us for those times. Faith is not a sprint, but rather a journey, and like any journey we have to make up our minds to keep moving ahead, to keep preparing and working towards on our relationship with God in the good times and in bad.


We have appreciated the celebratory nature of the Episcopal church and St. Andrew's. The prayer, support, and friendships you have given us have been the highlight of our five years.

Vestry Meeting Minutes
January 8, 2007

Action items are listed in red.

The meeting was opened in prayer.

Minutes of the Last Minutes: We need to clarify that the Vestry decided to add two Sundays of vacation time to the current 5 Sundays off per year. Gail Randall moved to accept the minutes as amended; Carla seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: There is more than a \$5,000.00 surplus in the operating budget for 2006. We were over our expected amounts in pledges and plate offerings. The progress on paying down the mortgage is good. Jon moved to accept the Treasurer's Report, Gail Randall seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Sr. Warden's Report: Cally is continuing to work on the website.

Rector's Report: Big Piney is maintaining. Jon has trimmed the log on the access ramp to allow for wider passage. Wes reminded everyone that we need to check the dumpsters each week and make sure they get taken to the curb. The feedback on the reserve parking sign has been positive. The annual meeting is coming up on January 28th. Each committee member needs to submit his or her annual meeting report by the 22nd. Cheryl will check with Phil on W-2s.

Old Business:

- 1. Dance:** Tabled until next meeting
- 2. Website:** Cally has changed the service times and the newsletters are updated. Cally is still working on putting the new Rota on the website.
- 3. Altar Guild:** Wes spoke to some members of the Altar Guild and they do not find the second service burdensome. The Vestry discussed the second service and has decided to continue holding two services for the time being.

New Business:

- 1. New Vestry Members.** Jordan Vana and Dave Lankford agreed to serve on the Vestry and Cally will continue to try to fill the remaining positions.
- 2. Budget.** The Vestry discussed the budget deficit. Fred moved to pass the budget with the amendment to increase the plate offerings to \$18,000.00, Jon seconded the motion and the motion was passed unanimously.

Open Discussion. The Vestry discussed upcoming events. The annual meeting is January 28th after a shortened 11:00 a.m. service. The church cleaning has become a problem. We will resume the monthly clean up, and announce in the bulleting. The Vestry discussed a donation request from the Crisis Pregnancy Center of Sublette County. Cally moved to donate \$500.00, Donna seconded the motion and the motion was passed unanimously.
