### SUMMARY OF THE JANUARY 19TH ANNUAL MEETING

We have a lot to ponder and discuss as a congregation, as our rector of six and a half years, the Rev. Melinda Bobo, is on a 3-month sabbatical, after which she will not be returning. She was here for the average time an Episcopal priest spends at a parish, and we wish her all the best for the future.

The Annual Meeting Packet is filled with good information about what is going on at St. Andrew's as well as financial reports. Print copies are available (narthex) as well as the PDF that was sent out via email to everyone on our email list. If you need a copy, please contact me.

Our main discussion centered on: Where is St. Andrew's headed? Erin Hastey facilitated this discussion, and gave everyone present a chance to speak. Vestry leaders emphasized that leadership would be working with people trained in transition, including Erin and diocesan staff, but also maintaining autonomy as we find the right path. We can use the next year of transition in a

positive, forward-thinking way with fresh ideas that fits our church community. Vestry members stated that they are committed to transparency and good communication every step of the way.

# Some ideas from our discussion for including parishioners' ideas and concerns:

• Have a monthly meeting, perhaps the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday at coffee hour, for Vestry to share progress and next steps being taken to decide on whether a new rector, priest in charge, or other clergy would be an appropriate solution to the vacancy

- Worship Team meets monthly and plans the coverage for worship; this could perhaps combine with the communication meeting
- Newsletter articles each month about next steps

If any parishioner would like an in-depth conversation about this transition, please contact a Vestry member. They are listed in every bulletin and in the newsletter, too. If you're not on the email list for the newsletter, there are print copies in the narthex each month. Let me know if you need to be on either the email or snail mail list!

Our Vestry meetings are held the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of each month @ 5:30 pm, downstairs in the church. All are welcome to attend.

**Committee Reports**: The reports are available in the annual report packet, but a few items were brought up for discussion and celebration.

- Andrea Paulsen has agreed to be Summer Lunch Coordinator.
- Dave Hohl has agreed to help with the Rectory refresh, as he has good experience with construction projects of all kinds. He'll be taking a fresh look at the scope of the project.
- It was agreed that we would table the rummage sale for one year and concentrate on the pie sale. We will not be collecting and storing rummage for at least this year.

**Treasurer's Report and 2025 Budget**: The 2025 budget shows an excess of \$43,961, which will put us in very good position to be searching for a new clergy person. The budget was approved by both the Vestry and the Annual Meeting.

Vestry Election: Kelley Pearson is stepping down as Senior Warden but will continue on Vestry. Sarah Hixson and Teresa Lindenmeier terms have ended. Gifts were presented to them. Sarah Hixson is willing to serve again as Junior Warden. (A change in the Diocesan canons means that vestry members no longer have wait a year between terms.) Sarah Hixson was elected to serve a 3 year term, expiring 2028. The Vestry will have seven members instead of eight since no qualified candidate volunteered to run for the empty seat left by Teresa. This is within canonical guidelines, especially for a congregation of our current size. In the absence of a priest, the Vestry will elect the new Senior Warden at the February meeting.

#### **WORSHIP UPDATE FROM MEGANNE ACRES**

As the season of Epiphany continues, we are seeing the new rhythms of worship services for St. Andrew's unfold. We have options for lay lead Morning Prayer and Ante-Communion and in February we will host our first supply priest, Rev. Pamela Glasser. Our conversations will continue about the needs of St. Andrew's as we move forward, and it is good to know these terms that will be part of the discussions.

**Supply Priest**: a clergy person from the Diocese of Wyoming who travels to Pinedale to preside over a Sunday Holy Eucharist.

**Supply Priest Plus**: a clergy person from the Diocese of Wyoming who travels to Pinedale to preside over a Sunday Holy Eucharist but also offers additional time and ministry gifts to St. Andrew's.

St. Andrew's will compensate for each service provided, round trip milage and provide either a motel room or parish hospitality for lodging. If we enter Supply Priest Plus agreements the compensation and details of ministry are by mutual agreement between the Supply Priest and St. Andrew's.

**Parish Hospitality:** Supply Priest is hosted by a parishioner in their home should the clergy need to arrive the night before our service. If a clergy person is more comfortable in a hotel, then a parishioner might host them for dinner. For those who are interested in offering parish hospitality, an information form will be available in the narthex later in February and in the March newsletter.

**Discerning Supply Priest Plus Ministry**: In the narthex is a questionnaire. If you have already filled out a previous one, **please do so again** as the new one has been updated with great ideas from our congregation and the new one is more date specific and asks for priority preferences. #### **WELCOME REV. PAM GLASSER**

Reverend Pamela Glasser was ordained into the Episcopal priesthood on August 31, 2024 at St, Thomas EC in Dubois, Wyoming. Hailing originally from Detroit, Michigan, she had been raised in the Roman Catholic faith, having also carried Jewish roots through her immigrant ancestry. Pamela holds a bachelor's

degree in K-12 all music education from Wayne State University, Detroit campus.



Her Master's degree in horn performance was earned from Rice University in Houston, Texas. Post graduate studies, well over 100 hours, include foreign language, field science, world religion, education and psychology fields. Many changes in her life redirected Pamela into a deep spiritual search during the past ten years. She entered the Education for Ministry Program of Sewanee and completed the four-year basic program, then continued mentor training and served one year as a volunteer co-mentor. She was encouraged by mentors to enter our Wyoming Episcopal Diocese IONA program and discernment progressed in the three years of study that led to her Transitional Deacon ordination in June 2023 and the subsequent Priesthood ordination.

Pilgrimage experiences include "The Footsteps of St. Paul" in Greece, Holy Land and Palestinian perspectives, and a Tanzanian service trip. Now, acting as a supply priest for our Diocese, Pamela is enjoying serving and meeting congregations in

the western half of our diocese.

Rev. Pam enjoys spiritually-based poets and science fiction/fantasy writers and believes they can provide many inspirations toward a Jesus Christ-based life.

Favorite poets: Rabindrinath Tagore, William Blake, Kahlil Gibran, Favorite sci-fi: "Star Trek" (all the series), Favorite fantasy literature: C.S. Lewis' *Narnia* series and J.R. Tolkien's *The Hobbit* and *The Lord of the Rings*, Honorable mentions: a little known sci-fi trilogy by C.S. Lewis: *Out of the Silent Planet*, "Perelandra" and *That Hideous Strength*.

Somehow, the poetry and the story lines of such works always have led me to greatly appreciate our humanity striving toward true Christian justice and morality which our faith requires of us." Rev. Pam Glasser

#### THERE'S A PLACE FOR YOU AT ST. ANDREWS!

It's a truism that "to get more out of life, put more into life." In other words, sitting on the sidelines as a spectator - watching - is never as rewarding as being on the field or the court or in the corral or wherever, taking part, fully engaged in the activity.

This holds true for our church life as well. An easy way to be involved is by volunteering for a task, no matter how small. You can light the candles on the altar before service starts, then extinguish these afterward. Hand out worship bulletins before the service and say hello to people coming in the door. No ecclesiastical collar or permission needed – just a heart for other people, to help them feel welcome and cherished for joining us. Just do it, as the saying goes.

Another easy avenue is serving as a member of the Altar Guild. Once a month, you arrive 30 minutes early to set up for worship. In the quiet sanctuary, it will be just you and usually Joni, limbering up her fingers, running through the songs we'll sing that morning. Preparing for worship, you step into the small room on the left before the inside double doors. There you'll fill one glass carafe with wine, another with water, then gather the bread and/or wafers to place on a silver tray. These items for worship, along with the candelabras, silver chalice and napkin, are placed on a wheeled cart and moved to the front of the sanctuary.

The cotton cover on the altar is removed, folded and laid on the cart. Then the candelabras are placed on the front altar and wall shelves, then the carafes, and silver tray with bread are laid on the wooden table behind the altar. Moving the cart to the back, only one thing is left - place the offering plate on the table just inside the right door. It takes about 15 minutes to complete all of this, leaving time for quiet contemplation if wanted. After the service, the process is reversed, the glass items rinsed and cleaned, and everything put away neat and tidy. This can be done right after the service or after you go downstairs to enjoy fellowship.

While Altar Guild duties are done quietly and reverently behind the scenes, this simple yet profound role prepares our church family for worship. If you'd like to try the Altar Guild, let Joni Mack know, so a brief training session can be arranged. You'll be paired with an experienced Altar Guild member to gain confidence, then can go solo when you're comfortable. It will enrich your life to be plugged into the Altar Guild or other volunteer opportunities at St. Andrews!

#### December 9, 2024

- Called to Order 5:36pm
- 2. Affirmation of the Church's Mission
- 3. Minutes for November 11, 2024 Kelly Moved to accept / Julie seconded motion carried.
- Business
  - a. Visioning/Dream ongoing
  - b. Community Thanksgiving Dinner report Erin reminded all that Andrea spoke at church on Sunday. The next timed St. Andrews will be the hosts will be approximately three years from now.
    Kelly discussed the Master copy of the annual schedule of Church Events, and making sure we contact the other churches in August to start the discussion and organization of the event.
  - c. Worship plan for December and beyond

Rev. Randy covered December 1: vote to pay the \$125 supply priest fee – Randy would like the money to go into the Outreach Discretionary Account. Further discussion about the account. Close the old account and put it into Randy's own Discretionary Account. Erin will email Jessica letting her know that we'd like to return those funds to Randy, as they were donations to him, that he put in that account. If there is an issue that he will still be able to access. He may want to get gift cards to be able to hand out to people he interacts with, who are in need. Teresa Moved to pay / Kelley seconded – motion carried.

Supply priest update – We have a list from the Diocese. One is from Dubois, but has a transportation issue. Sarah asked if we could go get her. Joni has budgeted enough for us to have a supply priest once a month. Kelley suggested we talk to the Diocese if we get into a bind. Worship plan for December, Joni and Meganne have figured out the services for the month.

- d. Mental Health Grant discussion Joni spoke with Randy. There was a collaborative grant (\$50,000) from March of 2023. There is \$7,000 left. Joni is looking into getting letters from other churches by the end of December, or could also try again with the next quarter. Further discussion regarding the Boulder Roll and the Coalition Funds. Boulder Roll is a 501-C3. The Coalition is not, which is why St. Andrews houses their money. Decision was made to table the grant talk until January's Vestry meeting.
- e. Ratification of email decisions: Grant for Feed the Hungry (application made 11.21.24) Grant is \$5,000 discussion about applying for the grant, ratifying our email vote. Check to be presented to the Food Basket. Kelley moved / Sarah seconded, Erin abstained since she serves on the Board, motion carried. Discussion about presenting a check at the Board meeting this upcoming Thursday, December 12<sup>th</sup> and who could be available that day to join in the picture. Starbucks stock sale (11.26.24) total in money market account is now \$8,160.46 Joni spoke about the sale having gone through. The money almost doubled from the original donation.
- f. Rectory renovation Grant status Letter from vestry in support of application signed by all present.

  Joni said the grant is ready to go and there are funds to match. Further discussion about the Rectory and that we need to identify expectations when we have our next rector, that there needs to be a walk-through, at least annually.
- g. Update and Strategic Planning. Change signers on bank accounts Discussion about removing Melinda from our accounts Julie Moved / Kelley seconded motion carried. Sandy had to leave, signed off from Zoom. Discussion that someone else be added. Erin moved that Sarah Hixson be a signer. Julie seconded motion carried. Church cell phone Joni took the phone from Flor since the questions that would come up, Joni was having to answer anyway. Joni is checking the messages twice a day. Further discussion for the strategic planning. Would we need to keep the phone at all yes, was the answer to whether to keep the cell phone. Joni will keep it until the next Vestry meeting in January and give some feedback as to the calls she needs to field.
- 5. Treasurer's Report and Outreach Report on CDs:

\$15,000 Operating funds purchased 11.1.23 - matures 2.1.25 (4.91%)

\$22,220.56 Building Funds purchased 9.11.24 - matures 6.11.25 (4.47%)

\$10,450 Operating funds purchased 10.23.24 - matures 7.23.25 (4.02%)

Meganne Acres suggestion to use open offering Christmas Eve for school lunches in arrears – discussion and vote - Kelley suggests that we wait until after the offering to know what there is to work with. Outreach for November \$203.64; the total fund is \$379.85 as of 12.6.242025 Budget Draft:Randy is going to help with the Feed the Hungry grant. Joni said that expenses have been lower than expected. That people often wait until December 30th to pay their annual pledge. There was discussion about Melinda's HSA as to how much, Joni has a call into Jessica to get clarification. Erin moved to accept the Financial Report / Sarah seconded – motion carried. Discussion about the 2025 budget. Still more work needed on it. What was provided is only a draft. Erin suggested combining funds from the Youth, Adult Education, and Church School into one "Christian Education" line item.

- 6. Miscellaneous. Discussion about this upcoming year's Annual Meeting. Decided to hold on January 19<sup>th</sup>. Next Newsletter announce the annual meeting and discussion about the need for a Senior Warden and additional Vestry member since Teresa's term is up 2025. Decided that candidates must submit their names no later than January 15<sup>th</sup>.
